Bill Lucas, our current Inspector, has decided to run for an "At-Large" seat rather than Inspector.

All these names will be on the 2023 ballot, along with any and all nominations from units.

The NW. Dept. Adj. will notify all units in good standing of the proposed slate. Those units have until 1 April 2023 to make additional nominations for candidates of **ANY** and **ALL** Board positions. It takes two units, a first and a second, to nominate a candidate. This must be done in writing to the Adj. According to the NW Dept. By-Laws:

"Any Full or Probationary member of the Department may be nominated for *any* office by any two (2) units.

In order to nominate, a unit must be qualified to vote.

Nomination must be in writing and must be sent by certified mail.

The nomination must include the nominee's name, address, and telephone number.

The nominee's permission must be secured."

(From the Brigade of the American Revolution Soldier Manual, NW. Dept. By-Laws, Election Procedure)

I would add that although not a requirement, supplying the nominee's email address would also be helpful.

General George Washington, eager to bring some relief to his **oppressed army** at Morristown, New Jersey, issued this general order which commemorated St. Patrick's Day on March 17, 1780. Not only was this an opportunity to give his soldiers a day off from their labors, but this order recognized the Irish people's quest for freedom from British rule.

Genl Washington's congratulations to the army March 16th, 1780 on the very interesting proceeding of the parliament of Ireland and the inhabitants of that country have been lately communicated; not only as they appear calculated to remove those heavy and tyrannical oppressions on their trade but to restore to a brave and generous people their ancient rights and freedom and by their operations to promote the cause of America.

Desirous of impressing upon the minds of the army, transactions so important on their nature, the general directs that all fatigue and working parties cease for tomorrow the seventeenth, a day held in particular regard by the people of the nation. At the same time that he orders this, he persuades himself that the celebration of the day will not be attended with the least rioting or disorder, the officers to be at their quarters in camp and the troops of the state line to keep within their own encampment.
